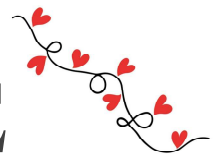

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MATT

The Strategic Mission Team (SMT) hosted a Spaghetti Dinner on February 1, where those gathered completed the Spiritual Giftabilities Inventory. If you were not able to attend the Spaghetti Dinner, please consider taking the Inventory **after the 9:30 a.m. service on Sunday, February 16**. The SMT will lead you through the process. You can also simply pick up a copy of the inventory at church in the narthex, take it on your own, and email a list of your top five gifts to the church at AdventLutheranRichboro@gmail.com.

Why is taking the Spiritual Giftabilities Inventory so important; what difference does it make?

Taking the inventory is important for three reasons. The first reason is that you have a chance to learn more about who God is creating you to be. People who have taken the gift inventory have their known gifts affirmed. They also may discover gifts and abilities within themselves they had not previously recognized. This purpose alone makes the Spiritual Gifts Inventory worthwhile. The full Christian experience is not just being loved by God. It is also sharing God's love with others. It is through our spiritual gifts that we most effectively accomplish this.

The second reason for taking the Spiritual Gifts Inventory is to discover the spiritual gifts with which we as a congregation are most abundantly blessed. We can then leverage the use of our gifts together to spread God's love more profoundly than we can do on our own. You see, the full Christian experience is more than receiving God's love. It is even more than sharing God love as an individual, although this is part of it. The full Christian experience is sharing God's love through Christian community. Only when we receive and share God's love as God's people together, pooling our spiritual gifts, do we truly become the Body of Christ in the world, performing miracles.

The third purpose of the Spiritual Gifts Inventory is to help Advent Lutheran in the next steps of the Strategic Mission Plan. The steps of the Strategic Mission Plan are:

- Spiritual Growth
- What are our Gifts?
- What are the Needs of the Community?
- Where do the Gifts and Needs Intersect?
- What is God Calling us to Do?



We need to know our spiritual gifts to be able to use those gifts to minister to the needs of the community.

Historically, congregations that show a dramatic turnaround discover one or two outreach ministries that pull the congregation together, giving it new momentum. This type of new ministry involves as many people in the congregation as possible, utilizing as many spiritual gifts in the congregation as possible. When the Holy Spirit reveals such a ministry to us through our discernment, it will fill the congregation with excitement and a deeper sense of purpose. Such a ministry is one of outreach, proclaiming the Gospel in the community where it is most needed.

The Spiritual Gifts Inventory is vital to Advent and the Strategic Mission Plan. The results of the inventory will be informing and guiding our congregation for months and years to come. Therefore, if you have not taken the Spiritual Giftabilities Inventory, please consider doing so.

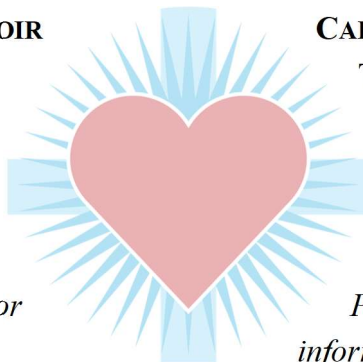

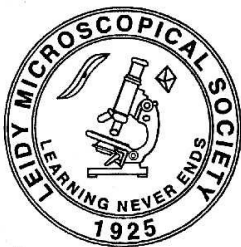

- Paper Bags



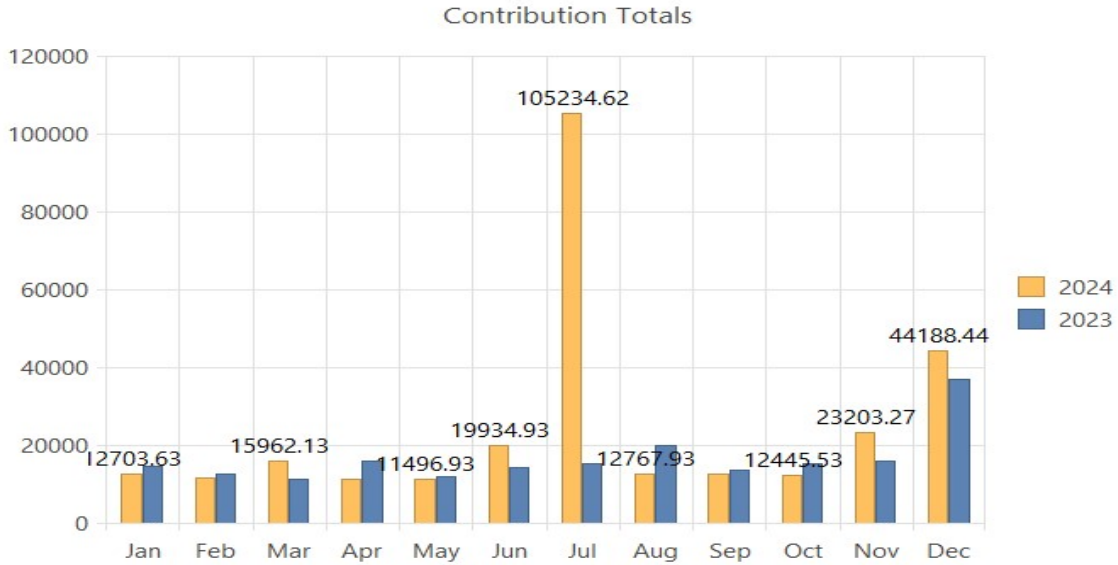
RECYCLING CAN TABS FOR RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARITIES

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that Bucks County played a crucial role for the Underground Railroad and the Abolitionist Movement during the 18th and 19th centuries?

Locations such as the **Newtown Theater** served as meeting places for the Abolitionist Movement. Fredrick Douglas and Lucretia Mott both spoke at the theater, then known as Newtown Hall.

Several locations in our area served as stops along the Underground Railroad which provided safe passage for thousands of escaped slaves. Locally, **Hampton Hill in Richboro** (pictured to the right), also known as the Bennet-Search House, is thought to have harbored many escaped slaves. The house was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1973.
