MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MATT

This year we begin the month of April in the season of Easter. Easter is about the gift of God's Grace through the death and resurrection of Jesus. In our Lutheran theology we have an equation for Grace: Law + Gospel = Grace. The Law reveals the human condition that we sin and cannot obey God. The Gospel is the 'Good News' that our sins are forgiven. When our sins are pointed out and when they are forgiven, we then experience Grace or the profound love of God. This neat, tidy equation is useful in teaching theology, but all too often such theological equations can become just that, equations. 'Law + Gospel = Grace' written on a marker board rarely moves people to great joy just by looking at it. 'Law + Gospel = Grace' doesn't usually make one's throat feel thick with emotion when we simply say it. This bare bones equation needs more flesh on it to have any real meaning.

One of the most moving expressions of experiencing God's Grace is the hymn 'Amazing Grace'. This is one of those hymns that changes people's lives. It's a hymn that has spoken to people's souls for generations bringing comfort and sparking faith.

'Amazing Grace' was written by John Newton. Life for him early on was hard and filled with much suffering. He was a seaman for many years until he was able to be a captain of a slave ship. His conversion to Christianity was on May 10th, 1748 when he found himself praying to God to get his ship through a storm. From that moment, God worked changes throughout Newton's life. He stayed a slave ship captain several years longer. Newton became a surveyor of tides and then eventually became a minister. 'Amazing Grace' was a hymn Newton wrote for the people of his parish. The hymn reflects how Newton experienced God's Grace through the many turns in his life where some moments were marked with the Law and other moments were marked with the Gospel. His hymn reflects this. Read through these four verses of 'Amazing Grace'. The phrases that reflect the Law are underlined and the phrases that reflect the Gospel are in bold. The whole hymn reflects Grace:

Amazing grace! (how sweet the sound) LONGE WAS LOST. In found That sav'd a wretch like me! I once was lost, but now am found, Was blind, but now I see.

'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, And grace my fears reliev'd; How precious did that grace appear, The hour I first believ'd!

Thro' many dangers, toils and snares, I have already come;

'Tis grace has brought me safe thus far, And grace will lead me home.

The Lord has promis'd good to me, His word my hope secures: He will my shield and portion be, As long as life endures.

Yes, when this flesh and heart shall fail, And mortal life shall cease; I shall possess, within the veil, A life of joy and peace.

The earth shall soon dissolve like snow, The sun forbear to shine; But God, who call'd me here below, Will be forever mine.

'Tis grace that BROUGHT US SAFE THUS FAR AND GRACE WILL LEAD US

As powerful as 'Amazing Grace' is as an expression of God's Grace, the most powerful expression of God's grace is the death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. May both 'Law + Gospel= Grace', 'Amazing Grace' and all the other trappings of the Easter season draw you closer to the love that God has for you, and may God's Grace become truly amazing to you.

In April, our Bible lessons will lead us through important events on the Christian calendar: The Last Supper, Jesus' Death on the Cross and The Resurrection of Jesus.



ADVENT'S NEW CONSTITUTION APPROVED

Hear Ye! Hear Ye! Advent Congregation has approved a new Constitution. This was accomplished during a Special Congregational Meeting on March 23, 2025 after a single worship service at which time a required 2nd vote (per ELCA requirements) to approve a new Constitution was completed.

The process leading up to the 2nd vote included two Q and A sessions about the proposed Constitution, which were held on January 19 and 26, 2025. During these meetings, members of the Congregation asked questions and sought clarification about the changes from the current to the proposed Constitution. Time was also dedicated at the Annual Congregational Meeting on February 23, 2025 to answer questions, etc. about the proposed Constitution. The Annual Meeting also included the first of two required Congregational votes to approve the proposed Constitution.

It is nice to bring this journey to a close, which began in 2021 when an Advent work group was formed to begin the discerning and writing processes for creating a new Constitution. This was followed with Church Council reviewing, editing and submitting the document to the Synod Constitution Committee for their review, which required two iterative submissions. This Synod Committee gave us approval to then proceed to the Congregation's voting on its adoption.



There are many people to thank for working on this important part of church governance and guiding us through the journey of its completion. First is the initial work group of Ray Heiss, Cindy Frey, Mike Sitler, and Pastor Matt. Second is Church Council, especially past Council President George Henry and Cindy Frey, for their dedicated and sustained work on the proposed Constitution. Last, but not least, is Pastor Matt for his personal and spiritual guidance and facilitation of the process with the Synod Constitution Committee. All of these individuals spent countless hours on the deliberation and writing of the new Constitution, ensuring that we were following the ELCA guidelines and requirements, while upholding and incorporating our values as a Congregation. We also need to acknowledge the Congregation for its steadfast commitment to and engagement in this historical undertaking for our Congregation. Our collective involvement will continue to be important in maintaining a living and vibrant Constitution that connects us with all ELCA Christians around the world and will be used to guide our policies, procedures, and organizational structure for years to come. Thanks to all for a job well done.

RECYCLING CAN TABS FOR RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARITIES



DID YOU KNOW? POETRY IN THE BIBLE

April is National Poetry Month in the United States. For Christians, we see poetry in so many places, including our prayers, our hymns, and in the Bible. In the Old Testament, most books contain at least some poetry, with five books – Job, Psalms, Proverbs, the Song of Solomon, and Lamentations – written almost entirely in poetic form. The Book of Psalms is particularly interesting when you look at the voice of the psalms. The rest of the Bible is written as God's message to us. The Book of Psalms, still written under divine inspiration, is designed to help us speak to God. The psalms are hymns of praise and prayers, giving us structure and inspiration to voice our own deepest feelings and aspirations.

Psalm 130:1-6

"Out of the depths I cry to You, Lord;
Lord, hear my voice.
Let Your ears be attentive
to my cry for mercy.
If You, Lord, kept a record of sins,
Lord, who could stand?
But with You there is forgiveness,
so that we can, with reverence, serve You.
I wait for the Lord, my whole being waits,
and in His Word I put my hope.
I wait for the Lord
