

Advent Evangelical Lutheran Church continues to worship indoors and online. In response to the increased COVID infection rate due to the Omnicron variant we have increased our COVID precautions for at least the month of January:

- -Adopt an abbreviated worship format for both Sunday services
- -No communion in worship
- -No singing in worship
- -No in-person activities or ministries beyond worship including Fellowship, Men's Breakfast, Stitch Club, Ping Pong Club, in person Bible study, etc.
- -Limit in person church office interactions

These precautions are in addition to our current precautions of:

- -Strongly encouraged mask wearing regardless of vaccination status
- -Social distancing
- -Sanitizing hands and objects handled
- -Staying home if you have any symptoms of illness or have been in close contact anyone with COVID.
- -The availability of online worship and the use of zoom for meetings.

Our leadership will gauge the situation week by week to determine exactly when we ease the increased precautions and will keep the congregation informed.

PASTOR MATT'S THOUGHTS FOR JANUARY, 2022

Have you made a New Year's resolution yet? Making New Year's resolutions is an old tradition found in many cultures. This is what Wikipedia says about the history of New Year's resolutions:

"Babylonians made promises to their gods at the start of each year that they would return borrowed objects and pay their debts. The Romans began each year by making promises to the god Janus, for whom the month of January is named. In the Medieval era, the knights took the "peacock vow" at the end of the Christmas season each year to re-affirm their commitment to chivalry. At watch night services, many Christians prepare for the year ahead by praying and making these resolutions."

Making a resolution this time of year is a noble act. It is a great thing to make a positive change in your life. Changing one's diet, amount of exercise or how you conduct your relationships can be life altering. Even small changes like remembering to turn off the lights when you leave a room or turning off the water when the toothbrush is actually scrubbing your teeth can have real world impact.

When I look at my New Year's resolution keeping down through the years, I have to say I've had mixed results. It is not easy to keep one's resolve when you feel a little too tired or to busy for a workout and when that yummy, not so good for you treat seems to be calling your name. Old habits can be hard to die. Some people simply avoid making resolutions because they do not want to disappoint themselves. Yet change is good. After all, no one is perfect.


What are we to do then to help us with our resolutions? We can turn to our Christian faith. We are in the season of Epiphany. Bible Study for Kids The Wise Men Followed the Star



From far, far away, the Wise Men traveled to see the baby Jesus. They saw a shining, bright star in the distance, which they followed as their guide. They brought special gifts to present to the baby, as this baby was God's son, whom God sent as he had promised. This was the Christ Child, born in Bethlehem.

The Wise Men, called the Maji, were intelligent and used their knowledge to find God's son. They left their homes, which were in the Far East, when they first saw the star. We imagine them riding on camels, determined to find Jesus. They trusted God's message from the prophets, who long ago had told of a savior who would be sent from heaven to free all believers from sin, before joining God in heaven.

In Matthew 2:1-14, we learn that the Wise Men reached the city of Jerusalem and asked King Herod, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star as it rose, and we have come to worship him." King Herod learned that this child had been born in the town of Bethlehem, just as the prophets had foretold, but Herod was concerned that this baby would become more powerful than he.

The Wise Men continued to follow the star toward Bethlehem. It led them to the place where Mary, Joseph and the baby Jesus were. The visitors bowed down before Jesus and worshiped him. "Then they opened their treasure chests and gave him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh." (Matthew 2:11)

God warned them about Herod's anger in a dream, so they took a different route on their way home. Soon, an angel appeared to Joseph and told him to take Mary and Jesus away from the area, as Herod would harm the baby Jesus if he found him. Joseph obeyed and took his family to safety in Egypt.
