Pastor Matt's November Newsletter 2022

Why are we taking communion weekly? The short answer for Advent Lutheran Church, at least as I understand it, is that when interim Pastor McKillip was here, he simply changed our practice from monthly communion to weekly communion. As far as I know, no real explanation was given to the congregation as to why, or, at least, not an explanation folks remember. Since our denomination encourages weekly communion and it is my preference as well, I have continued the practice at Advent. I do feel the congregation deserves a good explanation as to why. This is especially true because communion is on one level deeply personal and one's sense of spirituality around communion often is passed on from one generation to the next.

Why weekly communion? To be clear, the Bible does not specify how often we should take communion. Different expressions of Christianity have developed different traditions around communion. As Lutherans, and as stated in Advent's church constitution, we draw upon Martin Luther and confessional writing of the early Lutheran church at the time of the reformation. In Martin Luther's Large Catechism, he describes communion as "food of the soul" that "forgives, nourishes and strengthens us" against our "sins, death and all evils". Luther describes how our sins and the evils of this world regularly assail us and therefore we regularly need this "food of the soul." This is why a document called the "Apology of the Augsburg Confession" states clearly that our Lutheran practice is to celebrate communion on all Sundays and festivals (such as Christmas, that does not always fall on a Sunday).

Why are there many Lutheran churches that have celebrated communion less frequently than weekly for generations? The often-forgotten answer to this question is the Pietist grassroots movement in Lutheranism during the 17th and 18th centuries. Lutheranism at that time had grown more institutional and less passionate and personal. Teaching faith and theology became more academic and was less nourishing to the soul. The Pietist saw the irony of this given that Luther's theology was so informed by the personal, passionate, faithful, yearning of his soul. The Pietist brought much needed reform to Lutheranism. They introduced to church life lay Bible study and lay prayer groups which influences Lutheranism and Christian denominations around world to this day. The Pietist felt that communion had become a practice where folks went through the motions of the ritual without it having much spiritual meaning. The Pietist felt making communion less frequent made the ritual more of a special occasion and provided ample time for spiritual preparation to take communion. Because of the grassroots nature of the movement, different churches started adopting different communing practices: some monthly, some at Christmas and Easter, and a very few at just confirmation and the death bed. The Pietist movement for most Lutherans is long forgotten. Yet, churches and individuals that prefer communion less frequently usually quote quite concisely the Pietist justification as to why. In our area there is a relatively high number of churches with a history of less frequent communion. A big reason for this is that Henry Muhlenberg who planted the first Lutheran churches in our area during colonial times came from a Pietist seminary.

Weekly communion has deep meaning to me. There have been times of difficultly in my life where the promise of communion on Sunday helped sustained me through the week, week after week. I would go forward to take communion with tears in my eyes needing at the depths of my soul to hear words God's love is "for you." Yet, I can also understand how monthly communion can be equally meaningful to someone else. I have heard the wait to take communion each month described as being like the wait of the season of Advent for Christmas to come.

As the Pastor of this congregation with the responsibility to the spiritual nourishment of everyone in this community, I think it is important to remember that communion is not compulsory. You do not have to take communion if it is offered. With that said, church doctrine, tradition and personal preferences aside, I believe it is better to offer weekly communion at all our services. I understand and believe that it is less than ideal for someone to refrain from communion while others are communing that they may take communion once a month. Communion is a ritual of community. None the less, I believe it is even less ideal for someone to come to worship desperately needing "food for the soul" and go away hungry.

I hope this article at least explains why I, as the pastor of this church, have chosen to continue weekly communion at both services. It was not my goal to sway anyone in their piety or how they spiritually express themselves. Instead, I hope we can have deeper understanding and respect of the traditions we have inherited. This article briefly summarizes the history and theology of our communion practices. Let me know if you would like to have a deeper discussion.


