Pastor Matt's September Newsletter 2022

Happy Labor Day!! For most of us Labor Day signifies the unofficial end of Summer. Labor Day means more than this. Labor Day celebrates the accomplishments of the American laborer or worker in building up this nation. It also celebrates the rights for workers won by the labor union movement which started back in the mid 1800's and the industrial revolution.

The Industrial Revolution brought huge changes to how people make their livelihood. Before the industrial revolution most people would be what we would call self-employed farmers or craftsman. With the industrial revolution huge never before seen numbers of people where being employed in factories and other industrial operations by business owners. Many of the workers left their livelihood as farmers and so their livelihood became completely dependent on their employment. There were no rules early on. Some employers were good to their employees, but not all were. To be more competitive in the market many businesses demanded more and more out of their workers. There was time a laborer often worked 12 hours or more a day, in unsafe conditions, and for pay that was hardly enough to live on.

The labor movement began in order to address the working conditions of laborers. The labor movement did this by forming unions to confront business practices directly and by taking political action to pass laws to protect workers. These actions were consentaneous. Businesses in general did not like the labor movement, especially those that benefited the most from abusive practices. It was argued that the labor movement would destroy American business. Overtime more and more protection for workers was put in place and businesses discovered that well treated employees are more profitable to the business and society.

Today, there is a standard 8 hour a day, 40 hour work week, there are safety standards for the work place and there is a minimum wage. Things are much improved and yet there is still contention. In our politics there are those that are pro-union, courted union grassroots efforts and, those who are anti-union, courted by the business lobbyists. Business still argues that unions hurt American business. This argument takes on new weight when businesses can find less expensive labor in other countries. There are still workers today who work 12 hours a day between multiple jobs, in less-than-ideal conditions and still struggle to make ends meet.

How should we as Christians view labor issues in our society today? Should we be pro-union or not? Martin Luther in the Small catechism in praying for "workers of all kinds" references Ephesians 6:5-8:

Slaves, obey your earthly masters with fear and trembling, in singleness of heart, as you obey Christ; not only while being watched, and in order to please them, but as slaves of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart. Render service with enthusiasm, as to the Lord and not to men and women, knowing that whatever good we do, we will receive the same again from the Lord, whether we are slaves or free.

In praying for "employer and supervisors", Luther references Ephesians 6:9:

And, masters, do the same to them. Stop threatening them, for you know that both of you have the same Master in heaven, and with him there is no partiality.

We have this theology called original sin. Each of us has it within us to sin against our neighbor. Whether we as Christians should be pro-union is not the appropriate question. The heart of the matter is whether we are pro "love your neighbor as yourself". By the love of God, employers and employees should be accountable to each other. Where unions demand to much of business threatening the economic viability of the greater good, we should take a stand. Where employees are not treated fairly for their work, we should take a stand. Ideally, anyone who works fulltime should be able to live off the income they earn. In other words, an honest day's work for an honest day's pay. Employers deserve an honest day's work and employees in return deserve and honest day's pay. This is how employers and employees "render service with enthusiasm" to each other and fulfill the law of "love your neighbor as yourself". I know labor issues are complex and there are no easy answers. Nonetheless, this Labor Day, I challenge us to consider how we can better proclaim God's love through the labor issues of today



FINANCE UPDATE

The Finance Committee and Church Council thank you for your financial support throughout the year. For the year-to-date period through July 2022 expenses have exceeded revenue by \$34,793. For the corresponding period last year, expenses exceeded revenue by \$25,915. The increase in the current year deficit compared to last year is a combination of reduced donations and an increase in expenses.

We have recently secured very good mortgage terms with our lender, Mission Investment Fund, a Lutheran-based financial institution. Advent was able to extend our initial 5-Year Adjustable-Rate Mortgage (ARM) for an additional 5 years at the same rate we previously had, which was 3.875%. This is an excellent rate, considering that the Fed has increased borrowing rates by over 2.0% during this year, alone. Effective July 1, 2022, our mortgage payments were reduced by \$1,488/month, as a result of applying most of the proceeds from the sale of the tract of land to our mortgage principal. This will assist in reducing our current deficit.

For those who are able to help us address our deficit through contributions, additional donations specifically to Advent's "Current" offering category would be much appreciated. Thank you. Tony Gryszka, Finance Committee Chairperson
