PASTOR MATT'S MESSAGE December 2024: WORSHIP RENEWAL PROCESS

I am so excited that we are beginning a Worship Renewal process as part of our Strategic Mission Plan for Advent

Lutheran Church. To begin, let me answer a couple of questions for you:

Why do a worship renewal process? The answer is so that we may be filled more deeply with God's resurrection love in worship so we may pour forth more of God's love around us.

Will the worship renewal process involve change? Yes, the process will involve change, though I am not able to tell you how much change. We will



find out as the process moves forward. I think our worship is pretty good right now. I can feel God's presence with us. The first part of the Worship renewal process is simply learning about how we worship, what the parts of worship mean, and worship in general. These acts alone will renew our worship experience. As we learn about other worship practices, we may want to tweak what we currently do or try new things out. Learning new worship practices is like learning new ways to hear God say, "I love you". As we try new ways to hear God say, "I love you," we will be sure to keep the ways God says, "I love you" that are most meaningful to us.

How do we begin? Our first step will be learning about the parts of the worship liturgy. Our worship liturgy is like going on a date with God. In worship there are four things that happen that are like any date: Greeting, Word, Sacrament, and Sending.

During Advent, I will be preaching on each of the four parts of worship as part of a Worship Sermon Series:

Greeting (December 1st): At the beginning of worship is the Greeting. We say and God says to us how great it is to see you and be in your presence. This moment captures the yearning and joy of finally being together after enduring all the things in the world that would try to keep apart.

Word (December δ^{th}): On a date and in worship, after the greeting, you catch up with one another. You may reminisce on the past week or remember a time of joy or challenge you have faced together. You may express your concerns and might talk of what needs to done in the week to come. You speak words of love to one another. Reading scripture, the prayer of intercession and the sermon accomplish these things.

Sacrament (December 15th): Baptism and communion are things we do with God that bind us together with God, insuring our covenant of love. On a date having dinner, watching a movie, doing an activity like putt-putt, and being passionately intimate together are all ways way of binding ourselves one another and reinforcing any formal or informal covenants to love each other.

Sending (December 22^{nd}): The sending is saying good by at the end of the date. It is saying "I love you" and it is promise, a commitment, to continue to love each other. It is a moment of joy recognizing how loved you are and how that love will sustain you.

Come to worship in person or online. Come learn more about the worship liturgy so your experience of worship may be renewed.



NEW CONSTITUTION REVIEW AND VOTE BY THE CONGREGATION

We are writing to update the congregation on the final steps in what has been a fairly lengthy journey on adopting a new Constitution for Advent Church. It is nice to bring this journey to a close, which began in 2021 when an Advent work group was formed to begin the discerning and writing processes for creating a new constitution. This was followed with Church Council reviewing, editing and submitting the document to the Synod Constitution Committee for review, who required two iterative submissions. This Synod Committee has given us approval to proceed to the congregation voting on its adoption.

The process for the congregation's review and vote on the new constitution will take place as follows:

- 1. December 2024 the old and new constitutions will be made available to the congregation
- 2. January 2025 a presentation and Q/A session for the congregation
- 3. February 2025 1st Congregational vote
- 4. March 2025 2nd Congregational Vote

There are many people to thank for working on this important project and guiding us in the process to this point in time. First is the initial work group of Ray Heiss, Cindy Frey, Mike Sitler, and Pastor Matt. Second is Church Council, especially Council members George Henry and Cindy Frey, for their dedicated and sustained work on the project. Last, but not least, is Pastor Matt for his personal and spiritual guidance and facilitation of the process with the Synod Constitution Committee. All of these individuals spent countless hours on the deliberation and writing of the new constitution, ensuring that we were following the ELCA guidelines and requirements, while upholding and incorporating our values as a congregation.

Please actively participate in this final phase of reviewing and voting on our new constitution. Your involvement is important to creating a living and vibrant constitution that will be used to guide our policies, procedures and organizational structure for years to come. Please see Pastor Matt or Council President Mike Sitler if you have questions or would like any additional information. Thank you in advance for participating in this important part of church governance.

ROOF REPLACEMENT PROJECT COMPLETED

Our roof replacement project is now behind us with the final work having been completed in early November 2024. In addition to highquality shingles being installed, all of the gutters were replaced and realigned for proper drainage. The four skylights in the narthex and the large skylight in the multipurpose room, which dated back to when the facility was built, were also replaced. Paramount Home Solutions (Souderton, PA) was contracted to do the work. They were a pleasure to work with throughout the project, from working with our insurance carrier, getting Northampton Township permit approval, to high-quality installation work. They were also very generous in that they absorbed \$27,000 of the project's cost, helping to reduce out-of-pocket cost for Advent.





Paramount worked with our insurance company (Church Mutual), which resulted in a claim totaling \$81,385 for the roof replacement (total cost \$161,701). You will recall that Advent's land sale resulted in \$125,000 being set aside for the roof replacement, but because of the insurance claim reimbursement and Paramount's generous \$27,000 cost reduction, Advent's out-of-pocket costs for the project were greatly reduced. Still in play are two costs, which are under review by Church Mutual, but are anticipated to be paid by the insurance company.

Once all of the roof replacement costs have been paid, it is anticipated that Advent will retain around \$88,000 from the land sale for use in other capital projects (per the agreement with our mortgage company

Mission Invest Fund). Church Council is currently assessing and planning for other capital projects that are needed.

We have many people to thank for guiding this project through to its completion. First is Ray Heiss for his vision of selling part of our land, creating funding for capital improvements to include the roof replacement. Second is Church Council for their many hours dedicated to work on the project, in particular our Property Chair Lynn Roccograndi, Council President Mike Sitler, and Pastor Matt. These individuals spent countless hours in planning, contract talks, and on-site monitoring of the work being done.



All of this is a true blessing for our congregation at this point in our history. We can rejoice now that the roof replacement project is completed and make plans for other capital improvements that will serve our church family well into the future.




