PASTOR MATT'S MESSAGE FOR MAY AND JUNE

On April 20th Strategic Mission Team (SMT) hosted a spaghetti dinner at the church. My daughter and I cooked. Many folks helped set-up, brought sides and drinks, and helped with clean up. We had over thirty folks attending, which is a good turnout for our congregation size. The fellowship was wonderful. At the end of the dinner, we presented the next congregation activity of the Strategic Mission Plan: building a **God Sightings Chain**!

The SMT is encouraging everyone to help build a God's Sightings Chain. Here is what you do:

- 1. On Sunday pick up strips of paper at the Sightings Display in the narthex
- 2. Take the strips of paper home. As you see God active in your life blessing and sustaining you throughout the week, write your God Sighting on a strip of paper.
- 3. You do not have to write your name on your God Sighting strip. What you write will be for God's eyes only. You can make as many God Sighting strips as you want.
- 4. Bring your God Sighting strips to church. You can then loop your God Sighting onto the God Sighting chain and staple it into place or you can place it in the red box for a member of the SMT to staple it to the chain.

On **Pentecost Sunday**, **May 19**, we will hang the God Sightings Chain in the sanctuary. Throughout the Sundays after Pentecost we will continue to add to the chain until Reformation Sunday, October 27.

Here are some examples of God Sightings: Nature's Beauty, Acts of Kindness, Coincidences and Synchronicities, Miraculous Healings, Prayer and Meditation Experiences, Encounters with Strangers, Dreams and Visions, Inspiration and Creativity, Dark Nights of the Soul, and Reconciliation. There is a handout with a full explanation of each of these examples at the God Sightings display in the narthex of the church. In addition to these examples, there are also all the ordinary, mundane ways God blesses and loves us every day that we easily take for granted; such as the basic things that sustain our lives like food, shelter, and the air we breathe.

Why do God Sightings? Put simply, doing God Sightings is life changing! It is scientifically proven. Getting in the habit of doing God Sightings on a regular basis, such as naming 3 sights at the end of each day, increases emotions of gratitude toward God. In the past 15 years there have been hundreds of medical, psychological, and sociological studies done on the effects of "gratitude." The benefits of gratitude are profound. A simple internet search will show you. One article I found listed 31 Benefits. Here are some of them: more good feelings, more relaxed, more optimistic, increased self-esteem, improved sleep, more energy, improved decision making, increased productivity, kinder, more friendships and deeper relationships.

One of the benefits listed is "more spiritual". As a theologian, it tickles me pink when the sciences catch up with what religion has known for millennia. "God Sightings" might be relatively new terminology to you but it is an ancient practice that is known by other names such as "counting your blessings" or "thanksgivings." God sightings increase a sense of God's presence in your daily life. That sense of presence enhances a sense of security and deepened faith in God because you know "the whole world" really is in God's hands. By identifying God's activity in your life and in the world, you will better notice and better intuit the patterns by which God acts, patterns just like those found in the Bible. This is why doing the Book of Acts Bible study was so important before starting the God Sightings Chain activity as a congregation. As you better notice God's activity and love in your life, you begin to better sense or hear God guiding you and calling you to ministry. You go from being one who just sees what God is doing to one who participates in what God is doing; guided, empowered, and sustained by a constant sense of God's ever-present love.

PASTOR MATT'S MESSAGE (cont'd)

Why make a God Sightings Chain? Doing the God's Sightings Chain as a congregation is meant to encourage and reinforce the habit of doing God Sighting in our daily lives. The spiritual benefits of this spiritual practice are fundamental to the success of the Strategic Mission Plan. We need to have God Sighting-trained eyes for each of the next steps of the plan. God Sighting Eyes are needed to see and respond to everything God will reveal to us as we explore our gifts and blessings, listen to the needs of the community, and seek God's guidance and empowerment to form new ministries that match our gifts to those needs.

Please participate in building the God Sightings Chain. I also encourage you to incorporate doing God Sighting to your spiritual practices. I guarantee that if you name three God Sightings every night before going to bed, you will notice a real change to your life in one month.




