<u>CLASSES ON THE AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR,</u> <u>SCHEDULED FOR NOVEMBER 5 & 19,</u> <u>9 AM BETWEEN WORSHIP SERVICES</u>

Tri-Hampton Rescue Squad's Paramedic, L. Jay Colella is offering training in using the AED automated external defibrillator (AED), which is installed on a wall in the church main entranceway EMT personnel.

Training will take place on Sundays, November 5 and 19 between the Worship Services at 9:00 am.

An AED is a lightweight, portable device that delivers an electric shock through the chest to the heart when it detects an abnormal rhythm and changes the rhythm back to normal. AEDs help people who have a sudden cardiac arrest, which occurs when the heart suddenly stops beating regularly. This will benefit all persons and groups using the building.
