MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MATT

One of my favorite authors is Dr. Seuss and one of my favorite stories is “How the Grinch Stole Christmas”. I love the book. I love the 1966 Chuck Jones cartoon with Boris Karloff narrating. I am not as big a fan of the movies and shows that have come out since. They added a lot of extra stuff to the story. If you are not familiar with the story, the plot is pretty simple. The Grinch, who is a very mean creature, steals all the Christmas gifts and decorations from every house in Whoville on Christmas Eve in an effort to steal Christmas. On Christmas morning the people of Whoville celebrate without gifts and decorations. The Grinch witnesses this, has a change of heart and returns all the gifts. The book tells the story much better than I have portrayed it.

As much as the “The Grinch who Stole Christmas” is about Christmas, it can also be seen as an Epiphany story. Christmas is about the gift of God’s love coming to us through Jesus entering our lives. Epiphany is about what this gift means to us and our response to this gift. In Epiphany, the gift of God’s love, through the birth of the baby Jesus, is portrayed as light. God’s love is like a great light entering our midst. Light is power and energy. It feeds us. It reveals things to us. The elements of Epiphany are in the Dr. Seuss book. The Grinch cannot steal Christmas. In the story, Christmas is the love embodied in the hearts of the people of Whoville. When the Grinch witnesses this, he has an epiphany. The love of Christmas is revealed to his shriveled dark heart in a way it had never been before. His own wretchedness is revealed to him. The Grinch also has revealed to him the emotions of



love and joy which he had never experienced before. His heart grows three sizes. His response is to return the gifts he stole and to share the gifts of love and joy newly revealed in his heart with the people of Whoville.

When the light of God’s love shines into our lives, all the good and the bad of who we are is revealed. It is all revealed, like a light shining into our darkness, because God sees us and loves us completely. It can be difficult to have our sin revealed to us. Part of us may have the urge to run and hide. But there is great joy and power in knowing that God loves us in spite of our sin. This joy is so wonderful, that when truly experienced, it cannot be held back. It is a joy that is contagious and almost demands to be passed on as a gift to others.

May you encounter the light of God’s love in this Epiphany season; may you know the great power of this gift; may you overflow with the joy of God’s love to point the that you share this joy with all those around you; and may your heart grow three sizes as well.

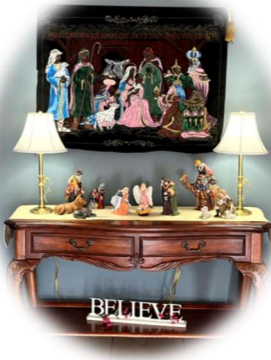

PRESENTATIONS AND QUESTION & ANSWER SESSIONS – JANUARY 2025

As laid out in the December 2024 Newsletter, we are in the process of adopting a new Constitution for Advent Church. The next step for adopting a new Constitution is to hold presentation and Q&A sessions for the congregation, which will be held after the late service on **January 19 and 26, 2025**. These will be interactive, providing insight and explanations of and answering questions about the changes in the new Constitution.

Two special congregational meetings will be held on **February 23, 2025 and March 23, 2025** for the first and second voting, respectively, to approve the new Constitution. More information about these meetings will be provided later.

Please take the time to read both documents to prepare for the next steps. Your involvement is important to creating a living and vibrant constitution that will be used to guide our policies, procedures and organizational structure for years to come.

TREE WORK PROJECT COMPLETED

You probably have noticed that our property has been spruced up with the tree removal and trimming of trees that took place just before Christmas. Powell Property Maintenance and Tree Service (Colmar, PA) was contracted to do the work. They were a pleasure to work with throughout the project and provided an excellent service, both in the tree work and in taking great care to ensure minimal disruption to the lawn during the work.



The work focused on removing dead trees on the two street sides of our property, which were becoming safety

hazards to include falling branches. In addition, the trees along 2nd Street Pike had lower-level branches removed, reducing future cleanup efforts of the property and making it easier (and safer) for our mowers to cut the grass around the trees. The tree row on the back side of our property (which is mostly conifers) was also

cleared of dead trees, which was increasingly becoming a potential fire hazard. A note of interest is that Church Council Member John Flint “thought he had helped to plant the conifer trees many years ago at a cost of less than \$2.00/tree”.

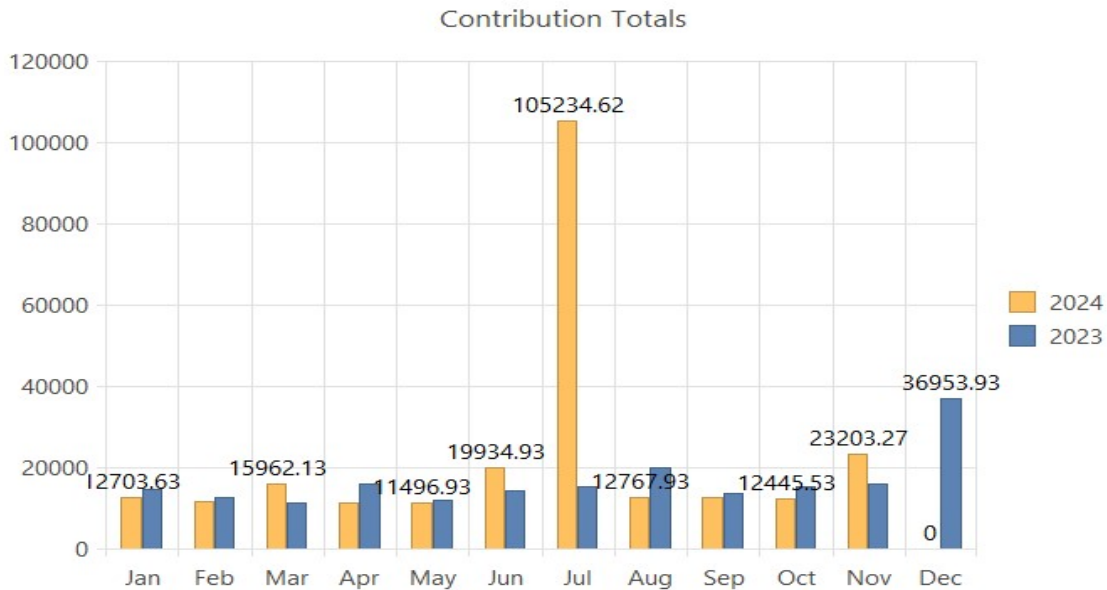
Church Council authorized the work after having received quotes from 3 different companies. Powell had the lowest quote (\$10,700) and provided the highest comprehensive services of the companies considered for the work. Funding for the project will be taken from the reserves from the land sale. Our mortgage company Mission Invest Fund has restricted the use of this money for capital projects such as the cost for this tree work project.



We have several people to thank for guiding this project through to its completion. First, are Lynne Roccograndi, Tony Gryszka, and Mike Sitler for their assessing the scope of the tree work that needed to be addressed. Second, is Church Council for their work in reviewing and approving the project. And lastly, special thanks to our Property Chair Lynn Roccograndi and Mike Sitler for their work in contract talks and on-site monitoring of the work being done.

All of this is a true blessing for our congregation at this point in our history. We can be thankful that our property is now a little safer and our “curb appeal” to the community is reflecting who we are as a congregation.

Richboro was originally known as Leedomville (also called The Black Bear by locals) before being renamed Richborough in 1830 after Richard L. Thomas, the first postmaster of the area, though some historians believe it was named after Dr. James Rich, a popular local physician at the time. The town name was eventually shortened to Richboro.

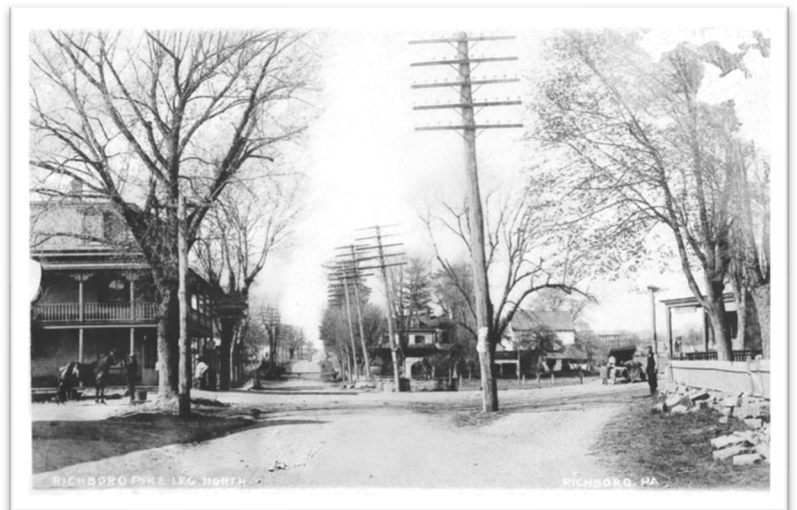
