MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MATT

"Touch grass"

The first time I heard this phrase was from my son in reference to spending time with friends online. "Hey, you've been online way too long. Maybe you should go touch grass." The phrase started off in pop culture in 2016 and is defined by The Merriam-Webster dictionary to mean, "to participate in normal activities in the real world, especially as opposed to online experiences and interactions." The way I heard my son use this phrase, though spoken with humor, was most certainly earnest. The online experience is a virtual reality that can suck you in. You can lose



yourself. It can be addictive and can harm health and hurt all your relationships offline. His generation and the coming generations are reaping the benefits and detriments of social media, virtual reality, augmented reality and artificial intelligence in ways beyond anyone's ability to fully understand.²

The power of the online experience to influence our sense of reality is certainly great and is novel to our brains, but the notation of "touch grass" is not really new. Have you ever heard the phrase, "stop and smell the roses?"

There are more influences in the world beyond those online that would captivate our attention and mold our reality. Commercials, politicians and their parties, news sources, social media influencers, and many more, all want to mold what we value and what we want. Many employers, especially big companies, pour lots of money into promoting a company culture with the primary goal of increasing employee productivity and profits. Not all of these influences on our sense of reality are primarily self-serving or bad. Every group we belong to creates its own sense of reality as our collective perceptions influence each other. This is true of even our friend groups, families and, dare I say, our church. Problems arise when these influences on our sense of reality twist what is truth, work toward our detriment or are contrary to the love of God, sometimes to the point of contradicting each other. As Abraham Lincoln said during the civil war:

"The will of God prevails. In great contests each party claims to act in accordance with the will of God. Both may be, and one must be wrong. God cannot be for, and against the same thing at the same time. In the present civil war, it is quite possible that God's purpose is something different from the purpose of either party..."

This is why it is important to take time to "touch grass". Furthermore, as a Christian, it is important to remember that God makes the grass. In the Gospels, Jesus will occasionally step away from everyone to spend time with God. When do you step out of your daily life, as you perceive it, and "touch grass"? When do you spend time in the reality that God has created to pray for the ability to see reality as it truly is? Do you ever take a moment to consider whether you see reality in the way God does? Many of the influences in our lives simply assume their reality is God's reality. Make time and space in your life to separate yourself from all the influences that desire to mold your reality. Great ways to do this are through prayer, meditation, spending time in nature, or doing God sightings on a regular basis. To truly "touch grass" is to be open to the possibility of encountering reality in a new way.





PROPERTY UPDATE

PARKING LOT RE-SEALING/RE-LINING PROJECT COMPLETED

You likely have noticed that earlier in the summer our parking lot was re-sealed and re-striped. MasterSeal Inc was contracted to do the work, which was completed the week of June 1st. They were a pleasure to work with throughout the project and provided excellent service, sealing large cracks, applying two coats of sealant, and relining the surfaces to our specifications.

Church Council authorized the work after having received quotes from 3 different companies. MasterSeal had the lowest quote (\$7,527) and provided the highest comprehensive services of the companies considered for the work. Funding for the project was taken from reserves from the land sale. Our mortgage company Mission Invest Fund has restricted the use of this money for capital projects.

We have several people to thank for guiding this project through to its completion. First, are Lynn Roccograndi and Keith Wills for their work in contract talks and scheduling the work. Second is Church Council for their work in reviewing and approving the project. And lastly, Mike Sitler for on-site monitoring during the week the work was done.

All of this is a true blessing for our congregation at this point in time. We can be thankful that our property is now a little safer and our "curb appeal" to the community is reflecting who we are as a congregation.


