#### **Advent Evangelical Lutheran Church continues to have these precautions:**


- Respect for those who choose to mask and/or social distance.

#### MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MATT

Hurricane season has begun as 'Erin' rages off the coast of North Carolina. Debbie and I are so grateful we finished our Caribbean cruise before 'Erin' came around. This gratitude is accompanied by images of St. Maartin. Visiting the island on the cruise, there are still parts of the island that have not recovered from the multiple hurricanes that struck two years ago. In hurricanes and other natural disasters, people are affected: folks lose homes, livelihoods and even their lives. When this happens, it is often asked by those affected, "Why do bad things happen to



good people?" Another question asked in the face of such a disaster is, "Why would God let such a thing happen?" These are heart-wrenching questions which can challenge our faith and our sense of security in the world. It seems that we live in a world where these questions get asked more and more often.

"So why do bad things happen to good people?" Of course, it can be argued that no one is perfectly good. We all do bad things. But in the face of the indiscriminate suffering of a natural disaster, it is difficult to say that everyone deserved it. There is a tendency for us to interpret the suffering we face in life as a matter of what we deserve or don't deserve. There is a tendency for us to believe that if we do good, God will reward us and nothing bad will happen to us and if we are bad God will punish us. There is truth in the fact that our negative actions can bear negative consequences in our lives; but this is different from seeing God as primarily a heavenly score keeper, doling out rewards and punishments. Such a view of God ignores Christ's sacrifice on the cross for our salvation and the forgiveness of our sins. God is about more than just keeping score.

"So why do bad things happen to good people?" According to our Christian faith, we live a fallen world. Since the moment Adam and Eve bit of that forbidden fruit, the world has been a mess. We sin. Often, we don't even know it or are unable to stop ourselves, but there are always consequences to our sins. We can be innocent victims of other people's sins. There are evil and destructive forces in the world that lash out at us, and it has nothing to do with us being good or bad. On top of it all, we are each mortal and the worst thing of all, death, will happen to each of us no matter how good we are. Suffering on the gulf coast can be attributed in one degree or another to all of these ways in which we live in a fallen world.

"Why would God let such a thing happen?" Why would God let our world be a fallen world where the suffering that natural disasters bring can ever happen in the first place? If God loves us so much, why doesn't God just make all sin, evil and suffering just disappear? Ironically, the answer to these questions is that God is about love. God's whole purpose in creating us in the first place is so that we can love God and God can love us. When scripture says we are created in the image of God, it in part means that we can love and be in relationships like God. God could force us to be good and love God. God could force the world back to its perfect state as it was in the Garden of Eden. But for God to do these this would require breaking our human wills and taking over our souls. By how we define and experience love, to force someone to love you isn't really love. God wants our love, not soulless puppets or servants forced to show love against our will. It is for this reason God doesn't just force the world and us to be 'perfect'. Yet, because God does love us, God is grieved to see us suffer. God comes up with another solution. Instead of preventing death and suffering, God has promised through the death and resurrection of His Son that whenever we do encounter death and suffering, we can know new life and healing. The ultimate fulfillment of this promise is everlasting life where we dwell in the presence of God's love forever. Christian Witness

When disaster does happen, God has not abandoned the victims. Just as Christ suffered on the cross, God is with them with the promise

of new life and healing. There are two ways God comes to us. One is directly through visions, dreams, prayer and meditation. The second way is though the witness of other Christians around us. This second way becomes all the more important when what one sees becomes disturbing, when the dreams have turned to nightmares and when one's suffering is so great that prayer and meditation seem worthless. We do God's work of fulfilling His promises of new life and healing when, through our words and our deeds, we are witnesses of God love to those who suffer.

- Reconfigure rooms in an organized manner








#### RECYCLING CAN TABS FOR RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARITIES
