MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MATT

There is a worship practice that we do not include in our services at Advent that is part of the liturgy in many churches. After the offering collection during a communion service, the ushers carry the offering plates and the communion elements from the back of the sanctuary and down the aisle to be offered up at the worship altar. Why would this be done? Both the money in the offering plate and the bread and wine for communion are gifts of God given to us. In bringing these things to the altar, we are giving of ourselves in response to all the gifts God has given us and expressing our gratitude. We are also participating in the further spread of God's love, as these physical things are then used to proclaim God's love: the money in the offering plate in support of the church's ministries and the bread and wine in the distribution of communion.

So often when we think of stewardship, we tend to think of giving of time, talent and treasure. We also think of sacrifice. By bringing the communion elements forward with the offering plates and then distributing those elements in communion, we make a statement that God's love should be recognized as part of that stewardship list. We are called to share God's love just as we are called to share of our time, talent and treasure. Therefore, in this sense, doing evangelism is a form of stewardship. We can share abundantly of God's love because God's love never runs out.



What about that sense of sacrifice? We are inclined to think of stewardship so much as our time, talent and treasure, that we can overlook that these things are gifts from God. When we feel these things come from us and not God, we can easily feel less generous or less joyful in our giving. As limited as our resources can seem, even when we truly have little, that little bit is still a gift from God. If we have limited time or talent, we can give more of our treasure. When we have limited treasure, we can give more of our time or talent. Either way, God continues to love us abundantly. Therefore, we can always give more through our expression of God's love.



By bringing the elements with the offering and using those elements in distributing God's love, one final statement is made. God takes our offering and multiplies it. Those elements are blessed. As the body and blood of Christ, they multiply as an expression of God, distributed to God's people in communion. So too, when we minister by offering up the time, talent and treasure with which God has blessed us, the encounter of God's love is multiplied.

I encourage you to consider your stewardship. How do you see God active in your

life? What time, talent, treasure and expressions of God's love can you offer up to God to see them multiply?

PROPERTY UPDATE

Round Two Tree Work Project Completed

In December 2025, we had dead and/or dying trees taken down on our property due to safety concerns. With that work behind us, we could now "see the trees for the forest" and determined that additional trees needed to be removed on the back side of our property, adjacent to the NHT water tower. This second round of tree work

was completed on September 9, 2025 by Warwick Tree Company, who removed 9 dead/dying pine trees and a "junk" mulberry tree. In addition, they removed several large piles of dead branches. They were a pleasure to work with throughout the project and provided excellent service, both in the tree work and in taking great care to ensure minimal disruption to the lawn during the work.

Church Council authorized the work after having received quotes from 3 different companies. Warwick had the lowest quote (\$2,000) and provided the highest



comprehensive services of the companies considered for the work. Funding for the project was taken from the reserves from the land sale. Our mortgage company Mission Invest Fund has restricted the use of this money for capital projects such as the cost for this tree work project.



We have several people to thank for guiding project through to its completion. First, **Property Committee Chair** Keith Wills, Tony Gryszka, and Mike Sitler for assessing the scope of the tree work that needed to be addressed. Second. is

Church Council for their work in reviewing the quotes and approving the project. And lastly, thanks to Mike Sitler for his work on contract talks and on-site monitoring of the work being done.

All of this is a true blessing for our congregation at this point in our history. We can be thankful that our property is now a little safer and our "curb appeal" to the community is reflecting who we are as a congregation.








RECYCLING CAN TABS FOR RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARITIES
