

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MATT



We prayed. We prayed for healing. We prayed that the life-threatening illness would go away. We prayed knowing that the illness might not go away. We prayed knowing that if new life was not to be had with this illness, then there was the promise of everlasting life. We prayed for peace. We prayed for the peace of knowing that whatever happened it would be okay, that God was with us, that our loved ones would be watched over and that we would be watched over no matter what.

We prayed. We prayed for forgiveness. We prayed for reassurance that God's love is real and that we are precious to God even in the face of our sin. We prayed for open hearts.

We prayed to forgive. We prayed to forgive, not because the other deserved it, but because our hearts needed to heal, to let go. We prayed for our deep hurt to be healed. We prayed with the hope that our broken heart might love again.

We prayed for direction. We prayed that God would set the path ahead. We prayed that God would provide in ways seen and unseen. We prayed that our worry would be eased and our needs met. We prayed for trust in God, to have faith that God has a plan for us.

Again and again, I have seen the power of God's love to heal, sustain, comfort and change lives. I have witnessed miracles. And I have reveled in praying a different prayer: a prayer of joy and thanksgiving!

God loves us. God loves us so much that He send us his Son. Jesus is born into this world in such a way that, no matter what your circumstance, Christ Jesus enters your life. He enters your life so that no matter how you may encounter death and the perils of mortality, the love of God brings you resurrection. In this season of Advent, I encourage you to lift up your deepest concerns in prayer as a Christmas list to God. And then I encourage you to watch for how Christ enters your life in answering your prayer.



CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATE

ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING AND COUNCIL ELECTIONS

The Annual Congregational Budget and Council Elections Meeting was held on November 23, 2025, after a single-service of worship. The meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor Matt. A total of 25 members of our congregation attended the meeting.



The first order of business was to review and vote on the proposed 2026 budget. The Finance Committee, consisting of Tony Gryszka, Cindy Frey, George Henry, and Janice Hoffman, as well as Pastor Matt and Mike Sitler had prepared the budget, which was then presented and discussed at the November 2025 Church Council meeting. Council approved the proposed budget as presented, which Tony Gryszka (Finance Chair) presented at the Congregational Meeting.

The 2026 budget reflects a 5.8% increase from the previous year. The increase was based on historical data, inflation, and anticipated costs. Line items within several of the budget categories were broken into greater detail for clarity and planning purposes. Copies of the budget were distributed via email to the Congregation the week of the meeting, and hard copies were available at the meeting.

After the presentation and following discussion on the budget, a motion was presented (and seconded) to approve the budget. The vote was unanimous to approve the budget.

The second order of business was to elect new members to Church Council. Per our new Constitution, a Nomination Committee was formed to seek and encourage people to serve on Council. The Nomination Committee consisted of Cime Eklund, Cindy Frey, Gary Zimmerman, and Mike Sitler. This process was presented at the Congregational Meeting, and then the floor was opened for nominations. John Flint was nominated (which he accepted) and then elected to a second 3-year term. His second term will begin on January 1, 2026.





We are grateful and thankful for the work of the Finance Committee, Nomination Committee, and Church Council. A special word of thanks to both Tony Gryszka for his leadership with the budget analysis and development and Cindy Frey for her administrative/computer work in preparing the proposed budget. In addition, the Congregation is thanked for fulfilling its governance role at Advent as well as financially supporting our ministries in 2026. A heartful thanks to all.

As this year comes to an end, let us give glory and thanks to God. We are an amazing Congregation, filled with love and actively living out our baptismal calls.





THE SYMBOLISM OF ADVENT WREATH AND CANDLES

The Advent wreath is a meaningful tradition practiced by many Christians during the season of Advent. The custom is part of the spiritual preparations that believers make for the coming of Jesus Christ at Christmas. The Advent wreath is a circular garland of evergreen branches representing eternity. On that wreath, four or five candles are typically arranged. Each candle represents an aspect of the spiritual preparation for the coming of the Lord, Jesus Christ.

Set on the branches of the Advent wreath are four candles: three purple candles and one pink candle. A more modern tradition is to place a white candle in the center of the wreath. As a whole, these colored advent candles represent the coming of the light of Christ into the world. Catholic tradition states that the four candles, representing the four weeks of Advent, each stand for one thousand years, to total the 4,000 years from the time of Adam and Eve until the birth of the Savior.

First Week of Advent - Prophecy Candle: On the first Sunday of Advent, the first purple candle is lit. This candle is typically called the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, primarily Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. This first candle represents hope or expectation in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

Second Week of Advent - Bethlehem Candle: On the second Sunday of Advent, the second purple candle is lit. This candle typically represents love. Some traditions call this the "Bethlehem Candle," symbolizing Christ's manger.

Third Week of Advent - Shepherds Candle; On the third Sunday of Advent the pink, or rose-colored candle is lit. This pink candle is customarily called the "Shepherds Candle," and it represents joy.

Fourth Week of Advent - Angels Candle: The fourth and last purple candle, often called the "Angels Candle," represents peace and is lit on the fourth Sunday of Advent.

Christ Candle: On Christmas Eve, the white center candle is lit. This candle is called the "Christ Candle" and represents the life of Christ that has come into the world. The color white represents purity. Christ is the sinless, spotless, pure Savior. Those who receive Christ as Savior are washed of their sins and made whiter than snow.
