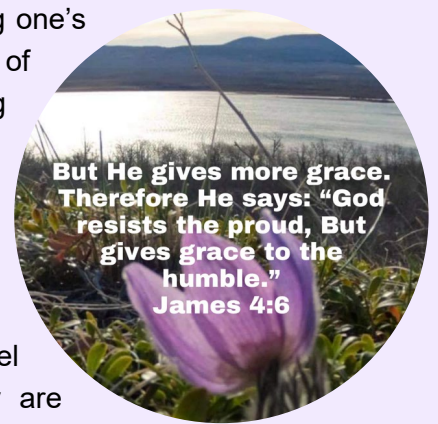
HEALTH RECOMMENDATIONS

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MATT

Humility, to be humble, is to honestly assess and accept oneself, including one's strengths and weaknesses, in such a way that they neither need to boast of their greatness nor hide their weaknesses. Humility is not about being shamed or disgraced, as it is often misinterpreted. Humility tends to be counter-cultural. We live in a society where value is placed on qualities being in control of your life, being right, to be reliable, independent, to never have to apologize, to be strong, or to be perfect. The sum of these qualities has been called, "rugged individualism." We like and admire these qualities. When we can actually exhibit these qualities in our lives, we expect to feel powerful and secure. These are incredible standards to live by. They are incredible because they are nearly impossible to maintain. As much as we would like to think that we possess these qualities and actually live them, often life is beyond our control; we do fall short, we are reliant on others, we are weak, we sin and are imperfect. As our society places so much value on the strength and virtue of individualism, that humility as a virtue is lost.

Why is humility so important? There are times in life that come upon us as relentlessly as the rising of the tide, where the individual is powerless and simply trying harder does not make a difference. Then there is the fact that we simply can't be perfect. We do make mistakes. Even worst, we will knowingly do what is wrong and still find a way to justify it. In such times, it requires humility to admit we need more than ourselves to be saved and that we may even need

to be forgiven. We need love and compassion of those around us, and most importantly, we need God. Such love and compassion can only be savored when we admit we need that love and compassion through humility. Without humility we are left to wallow in the consequences of sin and shortcomings, pretending they don't exist or blaming them on others. It is not enough to just hear that God loves us. Without humbly admitting our need for God, especially when convinced of our own rugged individualism as our main salvation, those words of God's love lose meaning. At best, God's love may sound nice, but not needed, because we can rely on ourselves. At worst, God's love may feel like an accusation of guilt or shame as it threatens to reveal what we are unwilling to admit about ourselves. To lack humility in the end cuts our sense of connection to God. It also cut our sense of connection to the people in our lives and the world around us.

The season of Lent is about humbly coming to terms with our true selves and then admitting our need for God and for one another. It is about renewing the promise of salvation in all aspects of life that comes through our baptism, not through ourselves. Yes, to be humble may not be easy in our culture today, but it also opens the door for true compassion, empathy and love.

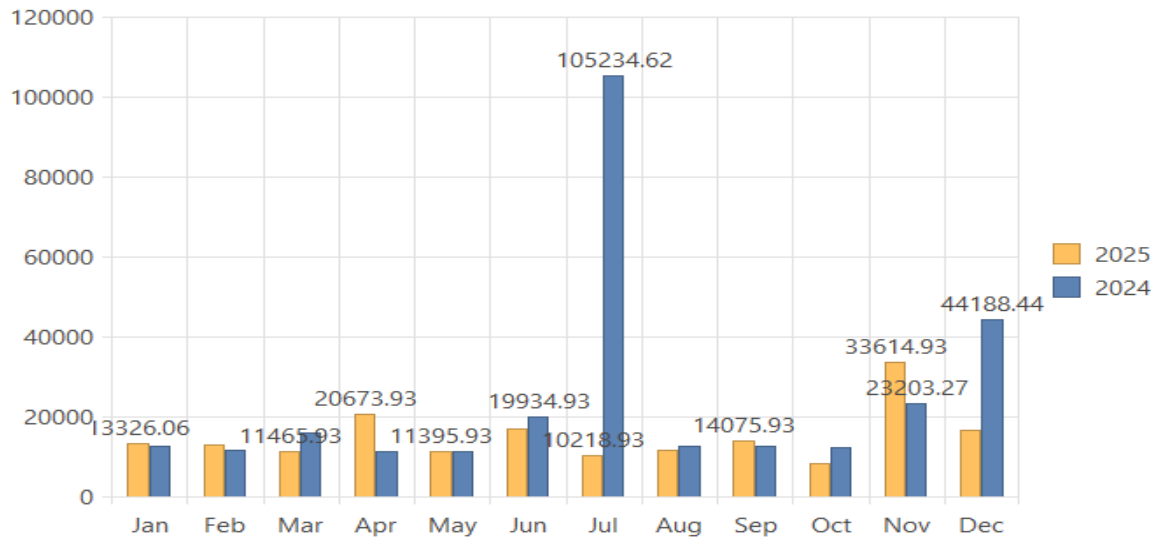

Lent

Definition

Lent is the forty-day season (excluding Sundays) of penitence and preparation for the Three Days of Holy Week and Easter.

A Very Brief History

The term “Lent” originally comes from the Anglo-Saxon word “lencen” which means “spring.” This is the time, in the Northern Hemisphere, when the days are lengthening. The season began as period of fasting leading up to the Vigil of Easter. Catechumens, those preparing for baptism at Easter, would fast and spend days in intense preparation. For those that were already baptized, Lent was a period to be renewed in their faith by studying the Bible, the Creed and the Lord’s Prayer.



Although it was originally only a two-day period of preparation, Lent became a three-week preparatory period in the middle of the fourth century and then this was further expanded into six-weeks, or forty days. By the end of the fifth century, there was a desire to exclude Sundays from Lent since Sundays are always celebrated as feasts of the Resurrection. Thus Lent begins not on Sunday, but on Ash Wednesday.

The current practice of forty days of Lent recall Jesus’ forty-day fast in the wilderness after his Baptism (Matthew 4:2, Luke 4:1-2) as well as Moses’ forty-day fast on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28).
